<u>Te777ing Time</u>.

<u>Vocabulary</u>: o'clock, past, after, to, before, quarter, half; in the morning, in the afternoon, in the night; noon or twelve-noon, midnight-twelve or midnight.

The first is the most common way: ex.5:00 a.m.; it's five o'clock or it's five or it's five in the morning. 5:15 a.m.; it's five fifteen. 5:30 a.m.; it's five thirty. 5:45 a.m.; it's five forty five.

The second is not so common: ex. 5:00 p.m.; it's five o'clock or it's five or it's five in the afternoon. 5:15 p.m.; it's a guarter past five. 5:30 p.m.; it's half past five. 5:45 p.m.; it's a quarter to six. (Remember the minutes from :01 - :30, you use past or after the hour. The minutes from: 31 - :59, you use to or before the hour. The Minute :00, you use o'clock)
