Telling Time.

Vocabulary: o'clock, past, after, to, before, quarter, half; in the morning, in the afternoon, in the night; noon or twelve-noon, midnight-twelve or midnight.

The first is the most common way: ex. 5:00 a.m.; it's five o'clock or it's five or it's five in the morning. 5:15 a.m.; it's five fifteen. 5:30 a.m.; it's five thirty. 5:45 a.m.; it's five forty five.

The second is not so common: ex. 5:00 p.m.; it's five o'clock or it's five or it's five in the afternoon. 5:15 p.m.; it's a quarter past five. 5:30 p.m.; it's half past five. 5:45 p.m.; it's a quarter to six. (Remember the minutes from :01 - :30, you use **past or after** the hour. The minutes from: 31 - :59, you use **to or before** the hour. The Minute :00, you use **o'clock**)

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
